Introduction to the Liturgy of the Day

On this final Sunday before Lent, our readings remind us of the commandments. God's infinite wisdom has given us laws that enable us to live a good, righteous life. Since we enter Lent later this week, today is a good opportunity to ask ourselves how we are keeping the commandments, especially the supreme commandment to love God and neighbor. Let us reflect on this as we prepare to receive the Lord in the Eucharist.

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word

Keeping the commandments will save us, Sirach says in the first reading, for God's wisdom is infinite and all-powerful. In the Gospel, Jesus expands on four commandments in particular, laying out their implications and explaining the spirit of each. For those who take the commandments to heart, the kingdom of heaven awaits. Let us examine our consciences, conscious that we have the power to choose between good and evil, between life and death.

Question of the Week

In what aspect of my life do I need to accept God's wisdom and the Spirit's guidance and change my behavior?

Ash Wednesday

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Day

Every year on this day we may hear, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return," as ashes are smudged on our forehead. Returning to dust is a sobering thought but in the first reading Joel offers a different kind of returning: returning to the Lord "with your whole heart." Reminded of our mortality in a dramatic way today, we are also reminded that Lent is an opportunity to repent in our hearts, to seek forgiveness, and to return wholeheartedly to our merciful God. May the ashes we wear today be a reminder of this return as well.

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word

Joel set the tone for the day, calling for us to return to God with our whole heart. Lent is not a time for halfhearted gestures, or acts done for show and without righteous intentions. Jesus teaches his disciples this in today's Gospel. May today's readings move us to make heartfelt changes to our lives this Lent, for as Paul writes, "now is the day of salvation."

How do fasting, prayer, and almsgiving keep me on the path to the cross and salvation.

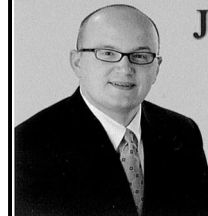

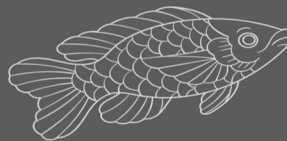

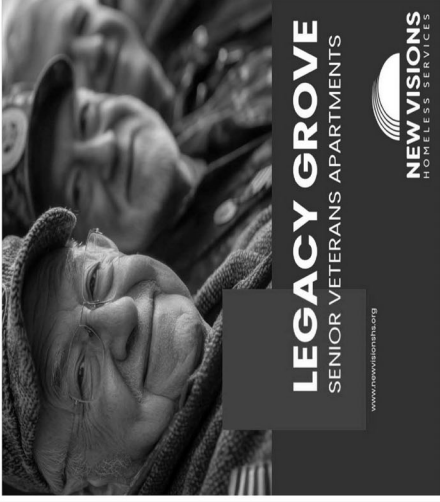

Hazel's Story (Age 5)

On November 10, 2025, little miss Hazel was admitted to Children's Hospital in Omaha and began the fight of her life. She was diagnosed with Atypical Hemolytic Uremic Syndrome (aHUS), an extremely rare (1-2 cases per million people per year), life-threatening genetic disease. Hazel was placed in an induced coma for several days and spent nearly six weeks in the hospital. She received blood transfusions, plasma, platelets, kidney dialysis, and the life-saving medication Soliris. Today, Hazel continues outpatient Soliris infusions every two weeks and will rely on this medication indefinitely. This diagnosis is lifelong, and Hazel will face challenges related to aHUS for the rest of her life.



Brielle's Story (Age 15)

On December 18, just one day after Hazel was released from the hospital, her big sister Brielle attended an appointment at Children's because she had been experiencing persistent pain while running cross-country. Within an hour of her appointment, Brielle and her family received devastating news: imaging revealed a massive tumor in her pelvis, spine, and left femur. She was admitted immediately for pain management and a biopsy, which confirmed a diagnosis of Chondroblastic Osteosarcoma. This type of cancer is often resistant to chemotherapy and difficult to surgically remove due to the tumor's location. Brielle has begun chemotherapy with the hope of shrinking the tumor ahead of a hemipelvectomy surgery scheduled in April at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, MN.



Despite the pain she had been experiencing for months, Brielle continued to compete at an extraordinary level. She qualified for the Iowa Girls State Cross Country Meet in November, placing 76th, showing remarkable strength and determination. She also pushed through rodeo season, competing in barrel racing and pole bending with her horse, Iani.

Tough Like Brielle — she is here to prove that ~~she can be~~ **she can be stronger than the setbacks.**
